Subject: Board Response

Dear Mr. Gedeon, PE:

Please be advised that the draft regulation regarding continuing PE professional competency credits (CPC) will be published in the NJ Register shortly for public comment. At this time the Board is not reviewing any additional courses. While there are several approved courses posted to the Board's website at: http://www.njconsumeraffairs.gov/pels/ceu_eng12.pdf, licensees are not limited to these.



For future Board approval of courses, it is anticipated that all CPC courses and programs must relate to the practice of professional engineering. Further, it is anticipated that courses that do not directly and materially relate to the practice of professional engineering with the clear purpose to maintain, improve or expand the skills and knowledge relevant to the practice of engineering, will not be approved. Finally, it is anticipated that the Board may reject any course or program that is required for initial licensure, or that involves practice building, practice management, or practice marketing.

The Board anticipates that a current licensee shall be required to obtain 15 continuing professional competency credits, 2 of which shall be in professional practice ethics, on or before April 30, 2012 to meet the requirements for the 2012-2014 biennial renewal period. CPC courses may be taken from May 1, 2010 thru April 30, 2012 to qualify for the 2012 - 2014 biennial renewal cycle.

In addition, the Board anticipates that for the 2014-2016 biennial renewal period, and every 2 years thereafter, a licensee shall be required to complete 24 continuing professional competency credits, 2 of which shall be in professional practice ethics. See:
